
The Realities of Spiritual Service

I am so thankful for the work that God has put into our hands! I enjoy all that I do along with the people with whom I am blessed to work with. The variety of the labor is great: Directing the **Bible School of the Americas** under the oversight of the Elders at Forrest Park, editing **El Expositor Espiritual**, a quarterly with fresh materials for the Spanish speaking congregations throughout the Spanish speaking world, the translation of the **Gospel Advocate Commentaries**, keeping in touch with our workers in Latin America, especially the teachers in our school and its extensions plus some of the local work. The manner in which the Elders here stand behind all of this work that is being done is so encouraging and inspiring. This adds so much credibility to this work of the Lord.

It is such a joy to see the difference that 2 years of Bible study in our schools does for these men and women. To hear them teach a class or have a part in the public worship before they come to school and then to hear them after graduation is such a shot in the arm because one realizes how all of this is helping the church.

The same goes for the sound effect that **El Expositor Espiritual** has in our brethren. It not only encourages through its teaching but it helps in cultivating the spirit of unity among our workers on the field. We often get letters soliciting the reception of the paper with very encouraging comments on the materials received. As editor of this paper, I try to keep it sound in its teaching, as well as the grammar, with materials for

everyone; those that are just beginning to read their Bibles, your more mature readers, as well as those in between. Articles for non Christians to encourage towards obedience are also included.



Our workers in Latin America did not have any commentaries like the **Gospel Advocate Commentaries** until they began to receive what we have translated and printed for them. You should see the faces of our workers when they receive a copy of these commentaries!

Of the fourteen volumes of the series, we have translated and printed five of them: **Matthew, Acts, Romans, 1 Corinthians** and **James**. The next volume to be printed will

be **General Epistles**. Pray for us in this effort that we will be able to finish the series before the Lord calls me home. I have been working on these for over a dozen years; of course, I do not do this full time. I have a school to direct, El Expositor Espiritual, etc. to attend to also.

In any good work there are **obstacles**. In our work we have two main ones that slow down the work:

1. A **lack of money** to do the work.
 - a.) As for the **Bible School of the Americas**, it takes \$425 a month for two years to put a student through our school which is what is called a scholarship. Many prospective students but only a few can come because of our lack of scholarships. To many of them we have to say no and that hurts. It also hurts when many of our graduates, some even valedictorians, cannot obtain support upon their graduation.
 - b.) **Printed materials:** It takes about \$10,000 dollars a year to print our quarterly. Because of a lack of money on occasions, we have not been able to print it. To print 1000 copies of a volume of the commentaries it takes about \$10,000. Churches and individuals have contributed to make possible the five volumes that we now have. We give these commentaries to our graduates and preachers in Latin America. We will soon be printing the **General Epistles**. To print it **we will need \$10,000 dollars!** Who will heed the call to help?
2. **Satan in diverse ways and forms:**
 - a.) He works through ungodly men that at one time were faithful but have now apostatized and give the church and the school a bad name.
 - b.) Then, there are other workers that we did not train who come along. They, without a foundation, through letters and other means try to discredit our workers on the field for their own agendas. They take pictures with some of our disgruntled workers as if this were their work.

No matter what the circumstances, we must not let obstacles like these effect us. We need to overcome these matters for the Lord's sake and we do. Please pray for the work laid before us, the men and women who labor for this cause and for all of us to have the wisdom to see and correct the obstacles placed before us.

Oh yes, also pray for those who wish to hinder our work that they may see their harmful ways and repent.

Editorial

Brother Mike Hixson and I went to David Lipscomb together in the eighties to study to be gospel preachers. Long hours were spent in talking about the Bible and preaching. Our favorite teachers were Carroll B. Ellis (deceased), Marlin Connelly, Tom Holland, and William Woodson. These men were sound in the faith and extra good teachers. (And when these men left, Lipscomb's Bible department fell apart!) We both graduated feeling anxious and yet ready to start our work as preachers.

We pursued local works and met when we could to catch up on things. I started going on annual campaigns with LAM in 1984, and went as often as possible while doing local work. In 1994 I moved to Valdosta to do missions full time. Mike continued with local work sought to polish his pulpit skills, then started working with Gospel Broadcasting Network a couple of years ago as a national field representative. Mike recently has been promoted to Assistant Program Director.

Several months ago Mike interviewed me on GBN "Spotlight" to talk about the Lord's work in Latin America. Several points were covered; but there was one in particular discussed *outside the interview*, which is the main reason for this editorial.

Jesus wants the whole gospel preached to the whole world. "Into ALL the world" (emphasis RL) means the whole of it! I told Mike that "Works such as GBN can 'go' places that other works cannot. Yet, there is still the need for men and women of God *on the ground* to reach and teach the lost in person." He agreed and said, "We broadcast and you are more hands-on—yet the works complement each other in seeking the lost."

The primary goal of Latin American Missions is to fulfill the Great Commission by preparing native people to reach and teach their own. But, like the great work of GBN, we cannot do this alone. We need more faithful men and women of God to help.

The best place you can put your finances to work with LAM today is in the General Fund. This way, as brother Bryson says, "You can have a part of it all!"

Twenty-five years of hard work and long hours.


Twenty-five years of thank-you's and a few flowers.

POINT MAN

Rodolfo Espinoza: “A Faithful, Peruvian Servant”

One of the most influential men I have ever known is a peaceful gentleman named Rodolfo Espinoza. Though he is my father-in-law, he was first my friend and collaborator. Rodolfo is a well-rounded servant of the Lord, and has exhibited this quality through his ability to effectively preach the Gospel to the well-educated and illiterate alike.

Rodolfo grew up in a Catholic family, but knew from a young age that the Catholic Church was not the Church of the Bible. He came to know the real baptism of the Bible through his own study, and set out to find the Church that practiced this baptism. He found the true Church, the church of Christ, and was baptized for the remission of sins and added to the body of Christ.

In 1988, Rodolfo stepped out in faith in order to become a Gospel preacher. With his wife and two small daughters, Rodolfo sold all of his possessions, saved, and borrowed in order to travel to the country of Panama to study the Bible for two years in the Bible School of the Americas. He graduated first in his class in 1990.



Upon his return to Peru, he found the Lord’s Church in great need of sound biblical teaching. He has labored diligently to establish and edify the Lord’s church in Peru.

Rodolfo possesses the attitude of a true servant of the Lord, and as a result, much success is being realized in Peru.

Rodolfo works with about three congregations in Lima. The reason for his diligent service is not because there is not enough work in one congregation, but because there are not enough workers. With very few Gospel preachers in the country, Rodolfo also trains men for the

work by teaching in the Bible School of the Americas in Peru. Rodolfo is the hardest-working, humblest Gospel preacher I know. I would not be preaching today had he not encouraged me and assured me that I was capable of doing so. It is not uncommon to hear Rodolfo say: “The ability to preach the Gospel is inside you, but you must develop that ability.” My goal is to develop the attitude of servitude and humility seen in Rodolfo, and to one day develop into as diligent a worker as Rodolfo Espinoza.


