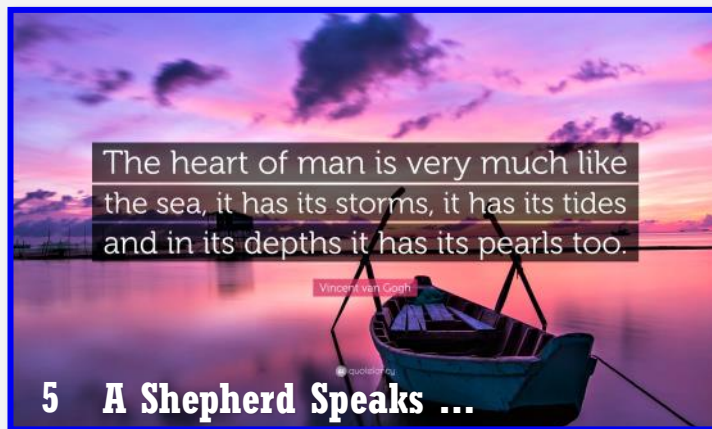

Some preach, some purse . . . the spread of the Good News requires both. Paul was able to preach to the world, in part, because he was sent by the church at Antioch and financially supported by churches like Philippi. Philippi seems to have been a key supporting congregation for him (cf. Phil. 4). Note what he says of the Church there in the letter he wrote them: *"For I am confident of this very thing, that He who began a good work in you will perfect it until the day of Christ Jesus. For it is only right for me to feel this way about you all, because I have you in my heart, since both in my imprisonment and in the defense and confirmation of the gospel, you all are partakers of grace with me."* Philippians 4:6-7 Paul felt that those who opened their purses to financially support his preaching and who encouraged him as he did so were just as much a part of the preaching of God's grace

as Paul was.

There are men all across Latin America who want to preach the Good News of Jesus, but they need training to do so. The Bible School of the Americas in Panama can provide that training. 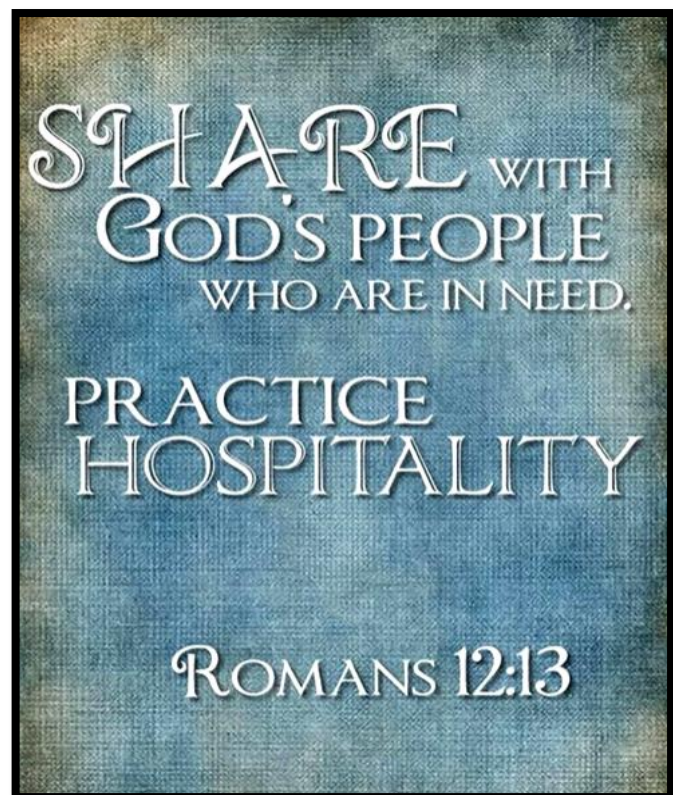

As we near the end of 2021, many thoughts turn to our annual givings, donations, and tax benefits. King Solomon spoke of the wisdom in handling our financial gains properly in Proverbs 24:3-4, *“Through wisdom a house is built, and by understanding it is established; By knowledge the rooms are filled with all precious and pleasant riches.”* Latin American Missions has been blessed to be the recipient of abundant giving from likeminded brethren the world over. We pray that 2021 and into 2022 the blessings will continue.

Below are some general areas where “planned tax gifts” can be of tremendous value to both the giver and receiver. As with all tax saving strategies, please consult with your CPA, Financial Advisor, and/or Estate Attorney to make sure your year end financial plan is the proper fit for you.

Stock and/or Mutual Funds: By bequeathing stocks directly to LAM as a charitable donation, the donator will save themselves from paying capital gains tax and LAM will receive the full value of the stock. The entire value of the stock at the time of the donation will be considered a charitable tax donation. LAM has an Edward Jones account set up specifically to receive these types of donations. If you are interested, please email dswilley@forrestpark.org to receive the form with transfer instructions.

IRA “Required Minimum Distribution” (RMD): An IRA owner, over the age of 70 ½, may make tax-free donation from their IRA to LAM. This distribution must come directly from the IRA. Speak to your tax advisor about setting up an annual distribution, or you may choose to set it up on a monthly basis. A donation of up to

\$100,000 annually is excluded from taxable income.

Real Estate: A gift of property that you own is a wonderful way to donate to LAM. Consult with your tax advisor and appraiser. The appraised value will determine the amount of the donation. This type of donation is also free from the Capital Gains tax.

Checks/Cash: The majority of our support comes from direct donations made either through checks, cash, or monthly ACH donations. You will receive an annual giving statement by the end of January the following year to use for tax purposes.

Wills, Living Trusts, & Life Insurance Policies: A gift of love at your death can also be made by designating Latin American Missions (Forrest Park Church of Christ) as a beneficiary in your Will, Trust and/or Insurance policies. Please be sure to list the beneficiary as “Latin American Missions/Forrest Park Church of Christ” to ensure there is no confusion with other organizations listed as Latin American Missions.

Memorial and Honorary Gifts: One other way to benefit LAM and memorialize or recognize a loved one is through donations made in memory or honor of someone. Please include the name of the person(s) being memorialized/honored as well as the names/addresses of their loved one that you would like to be notified of the gift. We also make mention of these gifts in our quarterly newsletter.

Chuck Morris, Jackson, TN

Thirty years seems like a long time when you are a teenager, but for most of us reading this article it seems like just yesterday. I was 19. Having always dreamed of being a doctor, I decided to tag along on a medical mission trip to Honduras. The blessing of seeing and doing things that I had dreamt of was something I was thankful for. While we were cutting on skin, God was cutting on my heart.

Late one afternoon, the doctor that I'd been working with went out to lead some songs for the children who were waiting on their parents. I was encouraged by his passion and the way he used his talents in many powerful ways. He later shared with me that ministry was truly his passion and he did medicine to create opportunities to share his faith. During that week, my heart and mind began to look at the purpose and mission for my life with new eyes. During that campaign, I was able to study with and baptize a father of one of the children who had come to the clinic. From that point forward, I was convinced that healing the eternal is far more important than treating the physical.

I returned home with memories that would shape my future. My friends and I began talking about putting together a medical mission team that would move away. Other friends were also stirred by our passion. Other campaigns for future student groups formed and grew. Though my friends and I didn't travel the world together, each of us have continued to do missions to this day. Personally, I changed my vocation from being a doctor to working for the 'Great Physician.'

Where did it all begin? It wasn't in a classroom. It wasn't from a sermon. It wasn't a mission's presentation. It was from Jesus saying, "Go into all the world." (Mark 16:15-16) It was from an older brother in Christ inviting me to be a part of a world changing, soul teaching, eternity impacting EXPERIENCE that would open my eyes to a God-sized vision for my life.

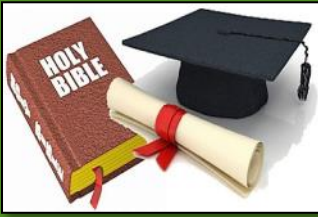

There is much discussion today as to how to help with the departure of our young people from the Faith. I would submit to you that inviting them "into all the world" to capture a God-sized purpose for their lives is a great place to start. Asking them to prepare before the trip in studies to deepen their own faith, leading them to process the experience through devotionals and journaling, and connecting them with the Family of God around the world will forever impact their lives and their passion and concern for missions.

As I began my youth ministry some 26 years ago, one of my first priorities was to create an opportunity for youth to be involved in missions. Guess what? Surprisingly, we returned to work in Honduras with a group. We went to other places as well, but those early trips reminded me again of the power of those mission trips to impact students. Four of my early students eventually became a part of an international mission team that worked to start a congregation in Asunción, Paraguay. One of the team's early students in Paraguay is now a missionary in a Hispanic congregation in Miami, FL. Another student on those early trips decided to be a youth minister (who has since taken several students to Honduras to work). Another is a full-time minister who has his eyes fixed on evangelism and saving the lost.

Over the years, it has been easy for me to focus on those who have walked away. It hurts. It's tragic. I often question things that we might have done differently. Yes, we need to continue to reach out, reteach, and remind them of the great love that God has for them and the eternal consequences of walking apart from the Lord. Are there things we need to consider as ways to be more effective in growing faithful disciples of Jesus? ABSOLUTELY!!!

Where Are They Now?

Boquete is a district that belongs to the Panamanian province of Chiriquí. I've been here since March, 2013. When we began working in this area, there were only nine faithful Christians. Thanks to our Lord, we now have 40 members and 16 kids who come for Bible classes. In the beginning, we found Christians who had gone astray and worked with the people in town through evangelism efforts. Later, we had restorations and baptisms.



to not help them using that same money. Also, Hurricane ETA came. Not only our church family lost their relatives because of the virus, but some got ill and others lost their homes due to being swept away by the river that grew with the hurricane. So, we've helped them with food, clothes, and a place to stay. For those that passed away, we were the ones to transport their coffins to a place for burial. We continue to have our meetings virtually.

To this day, I believe our number would be greater if all would keep listening to Jesus, but some have decided to fall away. Although we don't have our own church building yet, we do have a property that we bought five years ago. We were blessed to put together \$45,000 from our offerings and bought a field of 9,682 square meters for the church to assemble and worship God. The property is fenced with barbed wire.

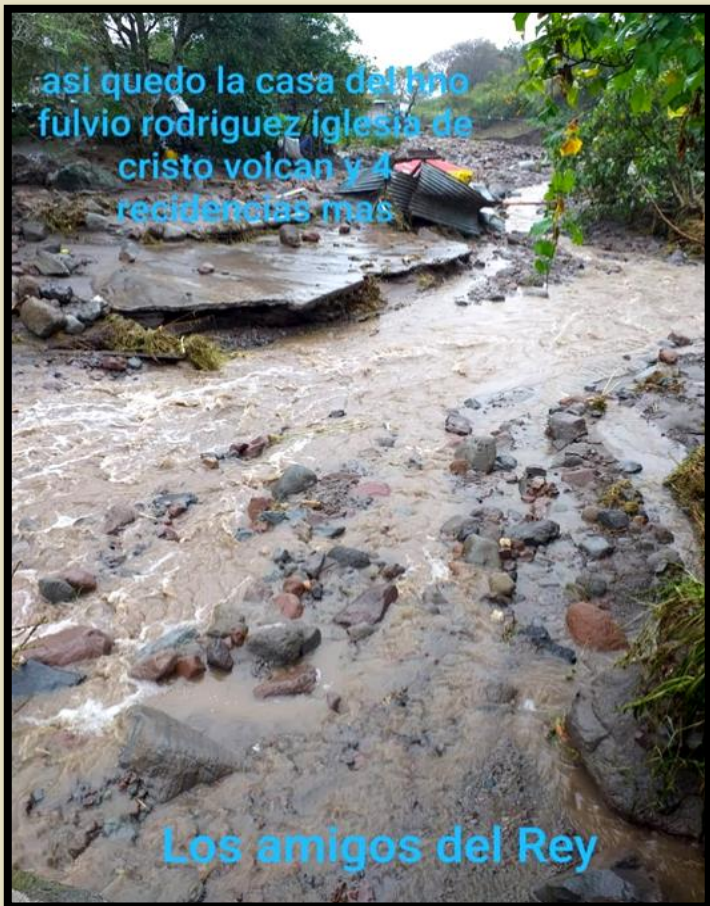
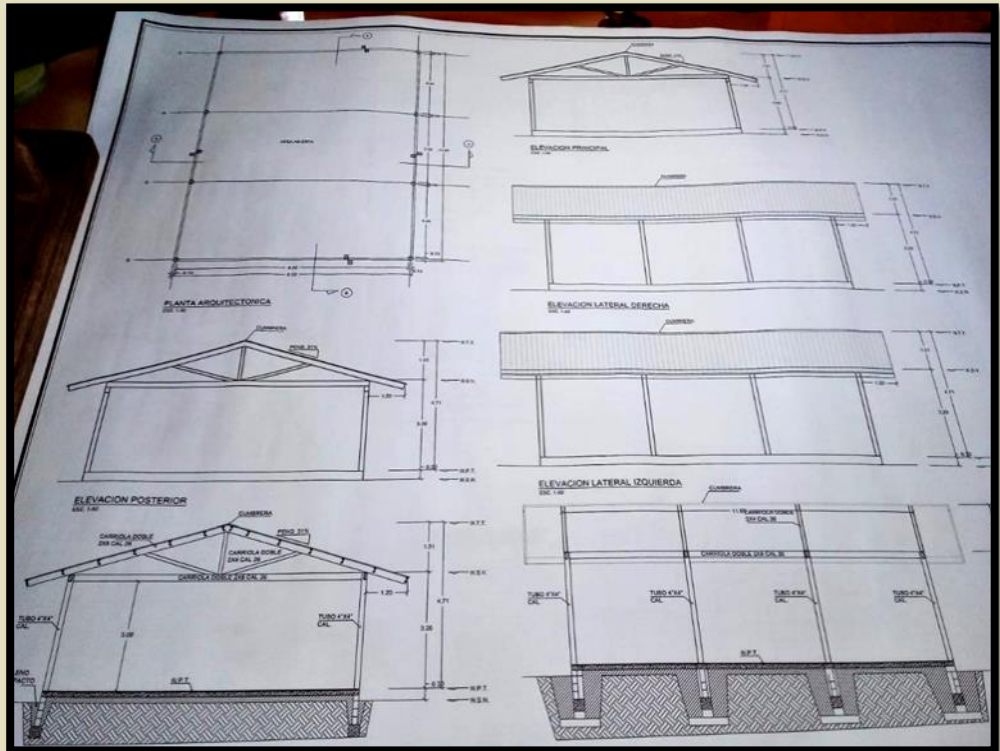
By the same token, we also work in the Volcan region, another district of the same province, Chiriquí. We began that work with brother Alirio Justavino, another preacher in town. We've baptized nine people and restored two souls to the Lord. The church at Vista Hermosa in Panama City was supporting us with rent for a meeting house. When the pandemic came, we weren't allowed to use the house because of its small size and the measures of biosecurity given by the Ministry of Health. Then, our brother, Agenor Rudas, informed us that, because of their building plans with the congregation in Panama City, they would no longer be able to support us with rent money. Our brothers and sisters from Volcan are joining our virtual meetings with the congregation in Boquete.



Yes, we had the money and planned to begin the church building project, but then COVID came last year. The pandemic put our brethren in difficult situations. Of course, it was impossible for us

We are encouraging ourselves and keep doing the Lord's work in the midst of all these hardships. We cannot gather in person, but

when we are allowed to go back, we don't have a place to assemble for Bible classes and worship. I believe there are doors that can be opened, but for now we ask for your prayers. We trust that God, as He has done already, will take care of all of us. Before this tragedy came, an architect made for us a blueprint for the proposed church building. Some further studies are needed before beginning the construction. For now, with the Lord's treasure we have, we still need \$5,000 to begin the first part of the building. Our desire is to return to our normal church meetings.
