

n arrival to the school in Panama begins with a fervent desire to be trained in deep learning of the Bible. But, converting that desire into reality is a path with many obstacles. It is choosing to leave the comfort of your native home and travel to an unfamiliar place, which means overcoming the fear that takes us when traveling to unknown locations which we are not yet familiar. It means leaving the job that sustains our family while knowing that in our countries a job is more and more difficult to find. It means convincing a wife and children that the decision is the right path to follow. It

means having the children change schools with all the paperwork involved in each country. The uncertainty of being able to find another job when returning home after two years of Bible training adequate financial because support to preach the Gospel is rare. The fear of going back to methods to study almost forgotten to succeed in the Bible classes. It means leaving your extended family, your congregation, your community and so many things

that one treasures as the years go by.

owever, all this is done to fulfill the desire of becoming an EMISSARY of GOD to preach the Gospel of salvation to lost souls. No wonder Abraham's decision is praised when he leaves his home and relatives without knowing where he would go, but with the firm conviction of being led by God.

hese men and women who decide to go to the Bible School of the Americas and study for two years are deserving of our admiration, respect, and support in time and finances. They are heroes, but not of the kind that wears a cape and flies in the comic books. Rather, they are true heroes who overcome obstacles to collaborate in transcendental actions that help lost souls to come from darkness into the light of eternity. There is no doubt ... A Final Tribute to

Jack and Nancy!

Jack "Panama Jack" Farber

Because of health reasons Jack submitted his resignation from Latin American Mission to the Forrest Park Eldership on June 21, 2021 effective December 31, 2021. He and Nancy moved to Jacksonville, Fl. to be closer to their son, John. This brought to an end a forty-four year of full-time commitment with Latin American Missions.

Jack and Nancy began their work in Panama and Latin America in 1977 while working with Bob Bryson under the oversight of the Lincoln Church of Christ in Huntsville, AL. During this time Jack and Nancy were involved in numerous campaigns in Panama. In May 1982 the Forrest Park Eldership in Valdosta, GA resumed the oversight of the Pan-American Bible School. That same year, while working with Bob Bryson under the oversight of the Forrest Park Eldership, Jack and Nancy moved to Panama to work full time with the school. In January 1983 the Eldership appointed Jack and Julio Cruz as co-directors of the Pan-American Bible School.

After three years in Panama, Jack and Nancy made the decision to move back to the U.S. In August 1985 Jack, Nancy, Jack David, and John Alan placed their membership with the Forrest Park Church in Valdosta, GA. Jack continued to work closely with Bob Bryson in our efforts to expand the work through the cooperation of the many churches of Christ that had become partners in this work. Jack wrote the following in a 1986 Forrest Park bulletin in response to the question, "Why Panama?"

"The easiest, and yet the most important, reason is because Jesus said, 'Go ye therefore, and teach all nations, baptizing them in the

name of the Father, and the Son, and the Holy Ghost." (Matthew 28:19) I went to Panama for the first time in 1977. I did not know what to expect; but once I got back, I knew that I would have to return. I had gotten a taste of what the Apostle Paul must have experienced. We had just planted a church in a location where there had never been one before. There was something special about the people and their hunger for the truth. Since that first encounter, all my other contacts in Panama have been the same. Latin America is a part of this world that is hungry for the truth. I believe with all my heart that Panama is the ripest field in all the world. With its influence throughout Central and South America, Panama truly serves as a location from which the Gospel can be spread to all of Latin America."

The graduate preachers of the school have always been a key element of planting churches through our evangelistic and medical campaigns. As co-director of the now Bible School of the Americas, Jack led in these efforts. In the beginning the name "Panama Jack" was truly fitting for Jack Farber, and maybe "Latin America Jack" would be more fitting today. Jack has served the Lord faithfully taking the Gospel of Jesus Christ to almost every corner of Central and South America. Even though Jack and Nancy are currently living in Jacksonville, they will always be a part of the Forrest Park Church of Christ Family.

met Jack in 2000 on a campaign for the community around the Bible School of the Americas. Shortly after, Bill Staggs told Jack that the Mt. Juliet elders were looking for a location in which to concentrate their work. Just six months later a devastating earthquake hit in El Salvador. LAM was not doing work in that country, and Jack went there to scout things out. That began a 20 year effort by LAM, Mt. Juliet, and Jack. Jack recruited and led numerous medical and evangelistic teams. He recruited men and families, young and old, to attend BSAM and then return to El Salvador to preach and work for the Lord. Over the next two decades I had the privilege of working with Jack during these campaigns.

anama Jack was a 'big teddy bear' of a man with a great smile and great laugh. He loved to sing, particularly at 6 AM, "Good Morning, Good Morning, It is time to..." and wake up the teams. It was such a joy to see him greet the brothers and sisters when they arrived for the campaigns with big smiles and big hugs all around.

se of the Lord's money was paramount with Jack. On our first campaign the team was on the bus ready to leave camp and head back to the hotel for the last night. We spotted a little old lady carrying an empty plastic oil drum on her back. Team funds had been used to pay a deposit on that drum. Jack was off to retrieve the drum. He always made sure that any funds donated for the work were used in the most effective way possible. Jack's excellent knowledge of the Scriptures was extensive. He always directed us back to the Scriptures on any decisions that impacted someone's salvation. Jack loves the Lord, His Church, and His people, and that permeates everything he does.

It was Spring Training 1979. I was in camp with the San Francisco Giants in Casa Grande, Arizona. Jack Farber, a youth minister at that time, encouraged me to speak to the youth group. I was a seasoned baseball player but an unpolished, rough, public speaker with limited Bible knowledge. He helped me, encouraged me, and made me feel I did some good.

Jack moved from Arizona and became involved with Latin American Missions. He would from time to time ask me to go with him on a mission trip. His constant plea for me to get involved, personally, finally resonated in 2002. It took twenty-three years of consistent gentle nudging from his first plea to get me involved again. I had grown in the Word, retired from baseball, and was serving as an elder. Jack had me go to Panama with him and do a baseball clinic with devotionals before, during, and afterwards. I was a one man band. He worked me, pushed me out of my comfort zone, and caused a love reaction for mission work in myself. I have gone to Panama, Peru, India, Greece, and Africa. I owe a deep debt of gratitude to Jack Farber for his not giving up on me and lighting the passion of spreading the gospel. He helped me be a better man and ambassador for Christ and the Church.

aving conducted himself in the highest standards of Christian living, Jack Farber served without watching the clock and an unlimited job description. He was a man you could have full confidence in to complete the mission. I've been blessed to know him, be loved by him, and have a loyal friend who always sought the best out of me and the best for the Church, always seeking to please Jesus Christ.

was privileged to attend the 2021 Graduation ceremonies in December at the Bible School of the Americas. While there I realized what an important and exciting event I was blessed to attend and want to share some of my thoughts, experiences, and observations with you.

uring their two-year stay (especially during the pandemic) these men and their families had to depend on and support each other as they studied for their degrees. It was obvious that their love for Christ and each other permeated the deepest parts of their hearts. There were hugs, laughter, and love that was so evident; it did not need a translation to be understood. It was heartwarming to watch how the children interacted with each other and the adults. Our teachers and students also focus on training the children "in the way they should go." Leading their own families is a great quality our students possess! On Thursday night before the Graduation, there was a dinner for all the graduates, their wives, and families. I did not need to understand their language to see the love that they had for one another and the bond they had in the Lord.

The 2021 Graduation had something very special about it. It took place on Saturday afternoon at the church building on the BSA campus. It was a hot and humid day, even by Panamanian standards...no air conditioning, just ceiling fans. That didn't deter the importance of what this graduation meant to the students and teachers. The graduates were dressed in suits and ties, their wives in beautiful dresses, and the children were dressed accordingly. Each student was given an opportunity to speak. The words expressed to one another and to the teachers brought many laughs and several tears. Since laughter is contagious, I joined right in! It was fun to enjoy their joy! Their love and appreciation for

their instructors were obvious. The teachers, also, expressed their love and appreciation for the students. How did I know without understanding Spanish? Handshakes, hugs, smiles, and laughter from teacher to student. I hugged them, too, and wished them well. I even used one of my few Spanish phrases, "Dios te bendiga." (God bless you!)

hile flying home from Panama City, Panama, I reflected on the past week. During the last two years, these graduates were under the guidance and protection of the teachers...just like a bird protects her chicks with her wings until they are ready to leave the safety of the nest. Within a few short days, they will be testing their wings and flying back to their home countries eager to spread the gospel. In nature, many young birds never make it, but I have every confidence that these men and their families are going to serve the Lord with greatness and faithfulness. From this day forward, they will be under the wings of our Lord as he protects them from the world. Flying home from Panama at 35,000 feet led me to the idea that these men, with their knowledge and talents, may fly even higher! They are ready to work in the kinadom.

ur responsibility to these BSA graduates is not over. All of us should continue to pray for them and their families as they minister to and work in their prospective communities. We thank God for the opportunity to have participated in a very small way in their quest for knowledge and understanding of the Scriptures. "...they shall mount up with wings like eagles..." ampers were divided into two groups: Titus (ages 17-22) and


