Rever you ever stood at the edge of the Grand Canyon? Do you remember the impression that looking down the rim made upon you? For me it was a "WOW" moment! Like most of the tourists at the Grand Canyon National Park, my Pentax camera was overworked. However, despite the pictures, not one of them provided the realism and created the "wow" of personally standing on the edge.

In January of this year, my wife, Cathy, and I along with Terry and Ruth McMasters were privileged to visit the Bible School of the Americas in Panama. This was my wife's and my first visit, and it was like standing on the edge of the Grand Canyon. It was a "WOW!"





As a gospel preacher and an elder, passing opportunity to see BSA first hand. We were blessed to stand on the edge and experience the school, students on campus, and the souls that daily make the training classes possible. We also realized how all the work done by many faithful brethren since 1958 resulted in the School of the Americas. The school was on break; but for Marshfield deacon Terry and his wife, Ruth, this was an opportunity to help with preparation for the incoming students. He was also involved in preparing the apartments for the incoming students. Terry and Ruth used their cooking skills to host various school personnel for lunch and dinner, as well as providing a BBQ one evening for all the staff and another for the on-campus students.

For Cathy and me, it was an opportunity to feed spiritual food. During our 23-day stay in Panama, Cathy was able to teach Saturday Ladies Days at congregations in Panama City and Boquete. I was privileged to preach in both locations. In addition, I was able to teach and participate in the Future Ministers Training Camp. The energy of the students, the teachers, and assistants was contagious. One of the great privileges I was given was handing out certificates to the students who completed the week long camp. But, the greatest blessing we were given was seeing young men baptized into Christ.

Throughout the years, Brother Jack Farber would give reports, show us slides, and give us a view of the work in Panama and LAM. We also had various local brethren give us reports of their medical mission trips and the work of BSA. But nothing was like the Grand Canyon moments of being able to drive through the front gate and experience in person the Bible School of the Americas.

b oth groups received training to prepare a Sermon with organization, illustration and how to deliver the application; sermons; fundamentals for personal evangelism; and a guide for baptism. Also, they receive instruction in song leading, how to read Scripture, serve at the Lord's table, and be leaders in their youth groups. The gualities needed to become elders were discussed. There was a study conducted for twelve of the young men who had not been baptized. We had several dynamics: sports, sermon elaboration, public speaking, and illustrations. At the end, we had a graduation with gifts, dinner for the entire team, and a blazing campfire. Each young man brought their torch and made a commitment to God.

BACKGROUND: The first camp in Panama was in 2010 and organized by **Kirk Brothers**. In 2011, **Jack Farber**, director of the BSA at that time, asked me to lead the program, and I immediately said, 'YES!' Thanks to God and the support of different congregations, FMTC has taken place every year since then.

PURPOSE: The first goal is to glorify the name of our God through substantial training in Bible for a week. Young men obtain necessary tools for ministering in the labor of God. The camp also serves as motivation to later study two years at the BSA.

FINANCING: We want to highlight the love and dedication to the Lord of several congregations who support this program: **Church of Christ in North Lexington**, **KY**; and the **congregation of Rolling Hills** (in the U.S.) *Amazing support during all these years!* Also, the **Church of Christ in Changuinola, Bocas del Toro**, and the **Church of Christ in Rio Grande** (Panama) sent financial support. *Thank you very much!*

Camp Results:

- -Record attendance of 62 campers representing 30 congregations
- -Four baptisms... Two during camp week, Jeremy López and Leonel Baker; and two more young men shortly after camp

The camp has made an impact in Panama during the 14 years since it began. Every year the number of campers has increased. More and more young men want to be a part of it. As a result of this program, there have been eight brethren who have completed the two-year Bible program at the BSA. Currently, they are doing an excellent job in the labor of the Lord. *May the glory and honor be only to our God!*





PLAN TO GIVE



-- Psalm 112:9



G od is a Giver. He gives us life (John 6:33), wisdom (Jms. 1:5), rain (Jer. 5:24), increase (I Cor. 3:7), strength (Ps. 68:35), victory (I Cor. 15:57), a crown of righteousness (II Tim. 4:8), His Son (John 3:16), peace (Ps. 29:11), grace (Jms. 4:6), and the list can go on and on (and on). God is a Giver. Of course, God also wants His people to be good stewards of what He gives them – and to follow His example and be Givers. Whether it be stewardship of the Gospel, of our lives and time, or of material resources (it all belongs to God), it isn't always obvious what methods of giving are available to us and allow us to best demonstrate wise and godly stewardship. Rather than only being *reactive* givers, let's also give thought to ways that we can become better *proactive* givers. A little planning helps. Here are some methods of giving you might consider:

• **Direct (Outright) Gifts:** This is the typical method most individuals use because it is quick and easy. You might physically give cash or write a check. To be more efficient and facilitate easier record-keeping, you may schedule a recurring (e.g., monthly) gift to be drafted from your checking account or mailed via your bank's online bill-pay service.

• **Bequests in your Will or via Trust:** Are you interested in making a potentially greater impact? You might be surprised how few individuals actually incorporate charitable gifts into their estate planning. Folks generally leave assets to their children – and that is understandable. But should you also consider adding a charitable beneficiary to your will or trust (or IRA, see next bullet point) for a portion of your estate?

Beneficiary Designations: Did you know that you can list your church or favorite ministry/charity as a beneficiary of your retirement account, life insurance, or annuity? Did you also know that there is a potential tax benefit in doing so? If you plan to leave a portion of your estate to a charity, it generally makes sense to leave pre-tax assets, such as Traditional IRA's or 401(k) accounts (and also some annuities). The reason is because 501(c)(3) organizations do not pay taxes on those gifts (whereas your children or other beneficiaries generally would). In this case, the charity doesn't have to "render unto Caesar" – so the entire gift is utilized.

• Qualified Charitable Distributions (QCD's): This is perhaps the most underutilized item in this list. This strategy has been around for almost 20 years but gained usefulness when the income tax standard deduction increased in 2018 – because fewer people itemize deductions on their tax returns now and, as a result, fewer people actually realize a tax deduction for charitable gifts. QCD's avoid that issue. By giving directly from your IRA (in the form of a QCD), you can deduct your gift and it also counts towards your RMD. The result is that you get to take the standard deduction on your tax return and deduct charitable gifts (which usually fall under itemized deductions) – so you get to double-dip. This strategy is specifically available to those age 70 ½ and older. The strategy makes sense if, (A) you are subject to Required Minimum Distributions (RMD's) on your IRA, and (B) you give to a church/charity each year. If you meet these conditions, you should discuss this option with your advisor and consider making those charitable gifts directly from your IRA.

• **Appreciated Stock:** It might make sense to gift appreciated securities "in-kind" – which means giving the actual shares of stock – rather than giving cash outright. Doing so may allow you to avoid paying capital gains taxes on the gains in the stock. You may even coordinate with your advisor to do this as part of an annual rebalancing of your portfolio. If you have appreciated stock in a taxable account and are making a significant gift, consider this option as an alternative to giving cash.

• **Real Property or Tangible Assets:** Did you know you can gift items other than cash or securities? Real estate or any personal property with tangible and marketable value can be gifted and generate a tax deduction based on the value of the gift. If you would otherwise be selling the asset anyway, you may realize a tax benefit by gifting the asset instead.

• **Other strategies:** There are other strategies, not discussed here, that you may also wish to consider, such as charitable annuity, donor advised fund, charitable lead trust (CLT) or remainder trust (CRT), and private foundations.

Tax Deduction Awareness: Gifts to qualified charitable organizations are generally considered tax deductible¹ and you should keep records of your gifts. However, as noted in the section above regarding QCD's, if you do not itemize deductions, you may not realize any tax benefit from your gift. Utilizing some of the strategies above could restore the tax advantage of charitable gifting. ¹ There are scenarios in which a gift may not be deductible. Consult your tax advisor if you have questions.

n my efforts to promote Latin American Missions, I find many wanting to give but not knowing the many ways a person can give to the Lord's work. We live in a complex financial world and recommendations concerning gifts and current tax laws should be left up to the professionals. **Special thanks to Jason Lockridge**, an Elder at the Estes church of Christ, Henderson, TN. for submitting this article. - To give U.S.A brethren opportunities to form relationships with ministers and congregations in Latin America who need supportive partnerships.
- To serve as a model for congregations that would like to do their own campaigns in the future.

These campaigns are an offshoot of the Bible School of the Americas, the hub of Latin American Missions. They are a joint effort with the network of ministers and congregations we have developed over the past seven decades. Take this opportunity to come on a campaign with us. 
