**T**his last year has been filled with unprecedented challenges to almost every facet of our lives. Our congregations have all been forced to deal with these challenges in the best ways we know how. Latin American Missions is no different. Who would have thought that we would be entering our second year in a row without being able to conduct a single foreign campaign? Who could have predicted The Bible School of Americas would be forced to teach their classes online and the residents of the Children's Home and school would be isolated to the school grounds? All of these things are incredible obstacles to accomplishing the mission and purpose of Latin American Missions. The good news is that none of these things are going to stop us from carrying out the great commission in Latin America because we are "More than conquerors!"

**T**here is far too much at stake for any one of us to shrink back simply because of trying or difficult times. The souls of men and women are at stake. We may not have been able to do everything that we have always done, but we dare not do nothing. This year we have knocked out literal walls in our facility to accommodate the social distancing needs of our students. Money has been provided to bring supplies for the children who were not allowed to leave the Children's Home. Congregations have been lifted up that were devastated by the events of this last year. Visits have been replaced by

phone calls and meetings have been transformed by Zoom. Even this summer we will be placing our focus on a Stateside Campaign/ Training Seminar to continue pushing the Gospel message forth and equipping us to return to Latin America next year.

**T**here is probably no one among us who is not ready for things to return to "normal." Plans are already being made to return our soldiers back into the mission field in 2022. Until it does and while Satan does his best to damage the Church through the issues plaguing our world, we must remain determined to capitalize on every opportunity we do have to carry out the Great Commission. It is overwhelming at times, but our God is greater than anything this world threatens us with. Paul encouraged the brethren with these words in Romans 8:31, "What then shall we say to these things? If God is for us, who is against us?"





# UPDATED NETWORK ON BSAM CAMPUS

Internet is one of the biggest commodities that we take for granted. It is in everything we do, and we do not even realize it. Having this instant connection to the world has shaped everything we do including connecting with friends and family, teaching, and even evangelizing. The Bible School of the Americas hosts not only instruction for the preaching students but also the wives and children of the preaching students who are separated from country, home, family, and schools. The world is changing fast, and Latin American Missions has been trying to stay at the forefront of this ever evolving communication expansion, but with it comes some major challenges. With the constant changes and the much needed additional bandwidth to manage these tasks of connectivity, there is often a need to change the backbone supporting it. This was the case at the BSAM campus in Las Mañanitas, Panama.

My father, Roger Steis, and myself set off to the school to help facilitate the necessary upgrades including a complete redesign of the network infrastructure, equipment, and cabling. We ran over 1000 feet of new cable, installed matched network controllers and switches, installed wireless capability to every building, and set Wi-Fi networks to help band steer the data to the programs and classes with the greatest need.

We made some amazing new friends with our brothers and sisters at the school. Francisco Gonzalez and Rafael Paguaga were the biggest assets to the work needed. Both brothers were excited to help and were by our sides

throughout the entire job. Seeing the passion and love these two have for the preaching school and the students made both Roger and I more eager to help. *Thanks* to Rafael for showing us what an "Arepa" is.



There is a lot of love at this school. Everyone was so kind and generous to us. Two people in particular won my heart; to be fair they gave me coffee and food, winners by default. Roger and Olga, students from Colombia, were always gracious, inviting us into their home, showing us the garden, and did I mention coffee? This was a journey I

will always remember...the work, but more importantly the people.

The network remains in need of some major work. Every apartment needs to be cabled and Wi-Fi access points installed. The fiber backbone needs to be rerouted and rerun. Lord willing, we will be able to finish this much needed work for the school. **The mission is still the same, "Go into all the world...;"** we're just changing how that happens.



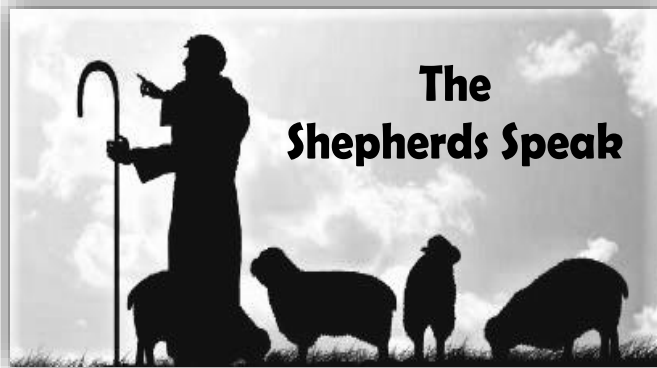
# Letter to All LAM Supporters

*Dear Brethren,*

It is with hearts that are burdened and broken that the Elders of the Forrest Park Church of Christ have decided to close the Children's Home of the Americas (CHAM) in Panama City, Panama. Simply stated, our mission statement for CHAM has always been **"to provide a Christian home where a child's physical, emotional, and spiritual needs are met as we teach the truths about GOD, His Son Jesus Christ, salvation, The Church and how to live a faithful, devoted Christian life pleasing to GOD."** We have always felt to accomplish this mission, children needed people who are living the mission statement as role models.

In the fall of 2020, the Panamanian Government changed the regulations for all the children's homes in Panama. CHAM was required to have additional staffing as counselors, tutors, social workers, and a first-aid provider. These requirements caused the firing of three Christian tutors and the filling of these positions with qualified non-Christians as Christian staffing was unavailable. These changes occurred in March of 2021. Christian staffing is seen as a necessity by the Eldership at Forrest Park to reach our goals.

Secondly, the Panamanian Government came in and removed all but six children within a few weeks. Two of these children were literally taken out screaming and crying to stay at CHAM. The point to be made is the government has complete control as to who is allowed to be in CHAM and how long they stay. The fact is that the government could close the home at any time they choose. There is no guarantee that CHAM would not become just a revolving door of children with no or little opportunity to

accomplish our mission statement. We have always looked to CHAM as a Gospel Opportunity just like we look at everything we are about in Latin American Missions.

While it can readily be said that the new regulations placed additional financial burdens at CHAM, the big reason for our decision is our inability to accomplish our spiritual mission for the children. Christian staffing and proper oversight were major considerations in our decision. Our financial commitments for the Children's Home will continue through the month of May and possibly June.

It is evident in our own country, as in all Latin America, that there is a great need for providing Christian mothers and fathers in all our homes for children today. This is why we are even more committed to training preachers in the Bible School of Americas (BSAM). We believe the Gospel of Jesus Christ will have a greater, positive impact on millions of homes throughout Panama and Latin America. We so appreciate all that you have meant to the children at CHAM. **You have made a difference!** We need you to continue in our partnership (fellowship) with the Lord's work in training preachers. **You can continue to make a difference!** We solicit your prayers and your continued support in the Lord's work.

There are too many regulations and restrictions in these countries to make a campaign run smoothly. Your safety is our number one priority, and we do not want anyone to get quarantined in a foreign country. We are again disappointed to not see all our translators, preachers, and friends this summer. Lord willing, we will be back in Latin American next year in the Summer 2022.

**H**owever, we are excited to announce that we are going to have a 2021 Summer Campaign here in the United States! The U.S. needs the Gospel and an Evangelism Campaign just as much as any other country. We are partnering with Rob Whitacre and the House-to-House School of Evangelism. Rob left full-time pulpit work in 2019 in order to travel all over the nation to teach churches how to be effective soul winners. Rob's purpose is to help, "Train the saved to teach the lost." When brainstorming on this idea with him, I expressed my desire to keep the YES II (Young Evangelistic Servants) strategy of training the Youth to do evangelism. 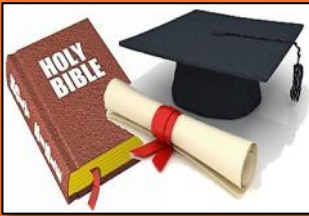
Naomi Raciné (left) was my translator. She was two years old when I first met her family in 1999. Naomi has been a joy to me!

# Where Are They Now?

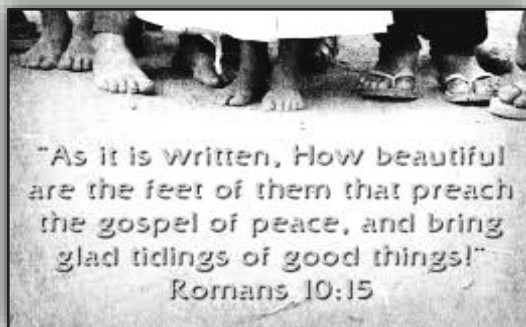

**M**y name is Domingo Pérez Montejo. My wife is Gloria Ramírez Martínez. My daughters are Keysy Sofía (11), Celine Elizabeth (8), and Emily Carolina (5).



## BEFORE I WAS A CHRISTIAN

**I**n the summer of 2002, I traveled to the United States of America looking for the “American Dream,” the same way as many Mexicans who migrate to the North. My parents did not approve of my trip. There were tears on their faces and sadness in their hearts. When I arrived there were many challenges and obstacles, the language for one. I decided to look for God and started to go to religious places looking for peace. After a year I moved to Mississippi. Close to where I was staying there was a building that said “CHURCH OF CHRIST.” Many of my compatriots said, “You should not go there; it’s not a place for Hispanics,” but I did not listen to them.

**O**n a Sunday, I went to worship services. The people welcomed me and asked me if I was a Christian. I told them I was, but they were not convinced. They invited me to study the Bible, and I said, “Yes.” Soon, I realized I was not saved. I was then baptized for the forgiveness of my sins on September 29, 2003 when I was 24 years old. I never thought I would find salvation of my soul in the U.S.A. Having the true Gospel preached to me has been the most marvelous thing that has happened to me in my entire life.

## BIBLE SCHOOL OF THE AMERICAS IN PANAMA

**L**ater, I returned to my hometown in Palenque, Chiapas, Mexico, where something interesting happened. There was no congregation of the Church of Christ in Palenque. Brothers Wade Bryan and Gary Williams called me and asked if they could come visit me at my home. They brought great news of an opportunity to receive training at the Bible School in Panama and become a preacher. After praying on this, I saw it



was something necessary and urgent. I made the decision to apply to the Bible School.

Thanks to these brethren who came and encouraged me. May God continue to bless them greatly. I was admitted to the school in 2009. After graduation, I returned home as a preacher and started the labor with my wife and oldest daughter, Keysy.

### MY EXPERIENCE FROM 2011 TO 2021

It has been an enormous challenge to establish a congregation in the area of Palenque. There had never been a Church of our Lord there, therefore there were no members. The path of starting the labor has been full of both blessings and obstacles. Thanks to the brethren from East Main in Mississippi, coordinated by Brother Bryan, together we began with evangelistic campaigns, knocking doors to preach the Gospel to people for the salvation of their souls, and inviting different communities in the area and far away. After a year we saw results with baptisms, but we did not stop there. We continued with campaigns and studies, spreading the Church of the Lord in Palenque.

Also, having a radio program in the Cho'l language (about 90% of the population and brethren speak that language) and in Spanish has been very helpful. Thanks be to God the community has opened its doors to us with the

opportunity to preach on the radio. But, we did not stop there. We conducted Bible conferences and campaigns twice a year. Little by little, the congregation in Palenque grew.

God has given spiritual growth to the Church of the Lord in Palenque. Radio programs broadcast on Tuesdays from 6 to 7:30 PM (also broadcast in Cho'l through Facebook), Thursdays from 7 to 8:30 AM, Saturday from 7 to 9 AM, and a special program in Cho'l at 1 PM. Our Bible conferences and evangelistic campaigns are held a minimum of twice a year. Participation provides support to other congregations in their activities. Personal evangelism is done through the contacts made. We hold Bible studies in the different villages of the municipalities of Palenque and Salto de Agua.

As part of their development to spiritual maturity, the Church has sent four men to be trained as preachers. Two attended school in Monterrey, and two attended the BSA in Panama. These preachers have established a congregation in the community of Salto de Agua. The Palenque congregation provides support to this young Church. And, God has given me opportunities to participate as a speaker in the conferences done in Panama, in Ocosingo, San Cristobal de las Casas, Tuxtla Gutierrez in Chiapas, and in Villahermosa Tabasco.
