atin American Missions is simply a ministry of the Forrest Park congregation dedicated to spreading the gospel in Latin America. The good news of Jesus Christ guides every decision we make. The hub of this ministry is the Bible School of the Americas in Panama City, where more than 600 students have been equipped with the gospel over 57 years. From there, they take the gospel to their home countries where they either take up the torch in established congregations or take forth the torch into new areas. We collaborate with these preachers to organize campaigns for promoting congregations, serving communities, and bringing the gospel to the lost. As these congregations mature, they develop young men into viable candidates for the Bible School of the Americas.

Within all these moving parts of the LAM ministry, there are many opportunities for you to partner with us in spreading the gospel. At the school, we

are finding so many viable candidates that we may need to make more room to house them! The school is our largest financial need. In the lives of our alumni, some have church



building plans, others are in need of their own land upon which to build, and all of them are in need of visits from encouragers and campaigners. ## Teaching "Romans"







enjoy mission trips. My first trip was while I was a student at Harding College. They worked hand in hand with the College church of Christ in Searcy, Arkansas. I wanted to spend part of my summer on a campaign and also work for school expenses part of the summer. I traveled to Hanover, Germany where three families were beginning a mission work. One of the greatest blessings was on the plane to Europe. They sat us in alphabetical order, and my future wife sat next to me. More about that some other time. She was part of a group going to work with missionaries in Holland. That summer compelled me to change my major to Bible and continue to go on mission trips. Being with missionaries on the field was like two years of school.

fter getting my B.A. in Bible, I attended the Harding Graduate School of Religion. I was impressed how many of my teachers at both schools had been missionaries. My Greek teacher at Harding worked in Zurick. I was blessed to not only have these teachers but also be with them on the mission field in the summers. After obtaining that graduate degree, I pursued studies in counseling.

rrently, as a minister and an elder, it is good to go work at the Bible School of the Americas. Being a preacher since 1976, I answer questions from the material and also from

experience. This past year I shared this with the students, "In the classroom the environment is like a microwave, but when you get in a local congregation it will be more the speed of a crock pot." My translator did not know what that was. Other times, some sports illustrations would not work well in that language or culture, but the gospel and the word of God is always understood.

have always tried to encourage our congregation to know and participate in mission efforts. It helps us from being only self focused. Jack Farber grew up not far from Chandler, Arizona, so we saw him when he came to see his family. Jack always invited me to go teach at BSA. About 12 years ago, I took Jack up on that offer. What a wonderful experience it has been for me! This past year while teaching Romans I told them, "If you get Romans, God will get you." It was a joy to see the Bible students understand Romans. Their desire to know the Bible, their work in the mission fields, and their future plans are encouraging to me. While spending time with the staff and their families, the love and service for each other was evident. In several of my classes, the students and I talked about and shared power point slides, names, and sources of material.

∧ s Otis Gatewood told me one day while in a communist country, "No one is born a communist; they have to be taught." And, no one is born a Christian; they have to hear the good news and surrender to Jesus. Several times while at BSA I have seen baptisms because they are teaching the Good News. Missionaries after World War II found if they brought students to America to train them, then they wanted to stay. It is easier, cheaper, and more productive to train men in their own language and a country similar to theirs. I have been blessed to go and teach at the Bible School in Panama for 12 years now. My own congregation knows of the work, and they are involved in what is going on in Panama. This is a wonderful work for the Lord!

nfortunately, some have unwanted anxiety as well. Often, the congregations these graduates return to, or establish as new, are small in number with limited financial resources and lack the ability to support a full-time preacher. This is a serious challenge for the graduate, as well as the program in general, and quite frankly the overseeing eldership at Forrest Park. All involved have failed if the graduate becomes discouraged or financially unable to preach and teach and does not use the education and training they've learned in the BSA. But we can change that by turning their anxiety of the unknown into excitement of the known! Will you help support these graduates financially in their new work during this turning point in their lives?

s we near the end of 2022, many thoughts turn to our annual giving, donations, and tax benefits. King Solomon spoke of the wisdom in handling our financial gains properly in Proverbs 24:3-4, "Through wisdom a house is built, and by understanding it is established; By knowledge the rooms are filled with all precious and pleasant riches." Latin American Missions has been blessed to be the recipient of abundant giving from likeminded brethren the world over. We pray that 2022 and into 2023 the blessings will continue.

Below are some general areas where "planned tax gifts" can be of tremendous value to both the giver and receiver. As with all tax saving strategies, please consult with your CPA, Financial Advisor, and/or Estate Attorney to make sure your year end financial plan is the proper fit for you.

**Stock and/or Mutual Funds:** By bequeathing stocks directly to LAM as a charitable donation, the donator will save themselves from paying capital gains tax and LAM will receive the full value of the stock. The entire value of the stock at the time of the donation will be considered a charitable tax donation. LAM has an Edward Jones account set up specifically to receive these types of donations. If you are interested, please email <a href="mailto:dswilley@forrestpark.org">dswilley@forrestpark.org</a> to receive the form with transfer instructions.

#### IRA "Required Minimum Distribution" (RMD):

An IRA owner over the age of 70½ may make a tax-free donation from their IRA to LAM. This distribution must come directly from the IRA. Speak to your tax advisor about setting up an annual distribution, or you may choose to set it up on a monthly basis. A donation of up to

\$100,000 annually is excluded from taxable income.

**Real Estate:** A gift of property that you own is a wonderful way to donate to LAM. Consult with your tax advisor and appraiser. The appraised value will determine the amount of the donation. This type of donation is also free from the Capital Gains tax.

<u>Checks/Cash</u>: The majority of our support comes from direct donations made either through checks, cash, or monthly ACH donations. You will receive an annual giving statement by the end of January the following year to use for tax purposes.

#### Wills, Living Trusts, & Life Insurance Policies:

A gift of love at your death can also be made by designating Latin American Missions (Forrest Park Church of Christ) as a beneficiary in your Will, Trust and/or Insurance policies. Please be sure to list the beneficiary as "Latin American Missions/ Forrest Park Church of Christ" to ensure there is no confusion with other organizations listed as Latin American Missions.

Memorial and Honorary Gifts: One other way to benefit LAM and memorialize or recognize a loved one is through donations made in memory or honor of someone. Please include the name of the person(s) being memorialized/honored as well as the names/addresses of their loved one that you would like to be notified of the gift. We also make mention of these gifts in our quarterly newsletter.

### Win Souls

Scriptures about the body of Christ, friendship, evangelism, service, and utilizing our talents to glorify God come to mind when I think about the recent Latin American Missions campaign to Monjarás, Honduras. 1 Peter 4:8-11, Hebrews 10:24, Psalm 133:1, Galatians 5:13, and 1 Corinthians 3:5-9. While on this trip, I witnessed brothers and sisters in Christ fulfilling the commands to take the gospel to the world and to serve each other through love (Mt 28:18-20, Mk 16:15-16, Gal. 5:13). The 22 campaigners from the USA, the 15 preachers and translators from Honduras, the three wonderful ladies who cooked for us, and the many hard workers of the Church in Monjarás all functioned as a unified team, each member fulfilling his or her role.

would like to share with you a bit about my personal experience during the week of the campaign. Although not my first mission trip abroad, this campaign was my first with Latin American Missions; and Lord-willing, it will not be the last. My primary daytime role was translating for one of the doctors in the clinic, and my evening role was translating and teaching in the children's class. Prior to this trip, I was accustomed to being part of Bible study teams on campaigns. So, translating in the clinic gave me a different perspective of the medical part of the work. I saw how important it is to help with people's physical needs so they become more likely to open the doors of their hearts for the message of the gospel. It was beautiful when I went outside the clinic to see the groups of people all around the church property studying God's word together! An added blessing of being in the clinic was getting to know Dr. Silvia, who began the campaign outside of Christ and decided during the week to put Him on in baptism!

ne aspect of the trip that I greatly enjoyed was getting to know my fellow Christians. Before this trip, I had met in person only one of the U.S. brothers and a few of the Honduran brothers. What a blessing it was to spend time talking, singing, and sharing God's word with those of like precious faith! The welcoming attitude of the Honduran brethren and the diligence in work and service of everyone on the team made a lasting impression on me. I am so grateful to God and to LAM for the opportunity to have gone on this campaign. I thank God for the longstanding brethren in Honduras and for the ten or more souls the Lord has added to the kingdom as a result of spreading His word during the campaign.

packaging medicine for the pharmacy, setting up tables and chairs for waiting patients, holding Bible studies with those who were interested, and in encouraging our whole team in their various activities throughout the day. I was reminded often during the week of 1 Corinthians 12...how the body has many members with various abilities, but how each member has an important job to do to make the body work properly. We all rejoiced together that week when ten souls obeyed the gospel and put on Christ in baptism, and we all prayed together fervently at the beginning of each day that we could be lights in the darkness and plant seeds for the kingdom. ### "Our PASSION and Our FOCUS"

everal months ago, I visited the Cane Ridge Meeting in Cane Ridae. House Kentucky. It is recognized by the U.S. Department of the building Interior as a national significance deemed worthy of saving. What an interesting place with so much history! It has been said that even the great pioneer, Daniel Boone, was involved in the of building the meeting house. Cane Ridge is considered by some to have played a pivotal role in the Restoration movement in the United States. Barton W. Stone's

impact on getting away from denominational names and being "Christians only" resonates to all of us in the churches of Christ today.

onsider the picture of the podium ... Notice anything missing? The preacher, of course! Imagine with me that your congregation does not have anyone to preach the Good News of Jesus. I would hope that someone in the congregation would step up and do their best to fill that role; but, what if you are a fledgling congregation and that maturity does not yet exist? I do not want to think what might happen to many of those small congregations. My friends, there are hundreds of small congregations in Latin America that do not have a regular preacher. Many evangelists there preach at two or three congregations in one day. Others rotate weekly at each congregation. The point is: WE NEED TO TRAIN MORE MEN TO PREACH THE GOSPEL! This is what the Bible School of the Americas does. This is our *passion* and this is our *focus*!

ne of the most recognized stories in the Bible is the "Rich Man and Lazarus." Often presented as a look into the Hadean world, there is



more to be discovered from it. Notice that the rich man had many worldly possessions and stature. Christ would not honor him even by mentioning his name. Why? Was it wrong to be rich, to have possessions, or to wear nice clothes? No, of course not! The only weakness mentioned in the text is that the rich man had zero compassion for those in need such as Lazarus. He saw Lazarus every time he went out the gate of his home, yet ignored Lazarus' desperate situation. Christ who was and

is the Champion of Compassion would have no part in honoring him. In fact, the time of the rich man's torment would come. Lazarus, on the other hand, was in great physical distress and even had to be carried to the gates of those more fortunate. Nothing is mentioned of Lazarus' character other than his suffering in this life. However, a new life of comfort awaited him after death.

ike Lazarus, the situation in Latin America is desperate. There is great need for trained men to spread the gospel. There are almost 667 million souls to reach in Latin America. We are the wealthiest people in the world. LAM is blessed to have some very faithful donors that exhibit the compassion of Christ. However, if you have not been giving to LAM, I want to challenge you personally to begin with \$25 per month. Have your congregations begin by giving \$25 per week. Surely, you understand that this is just the crumbs that fall from our tables.
